Roman designers would undertake a landscape survey to determine a central viewpoint looking toward the rising Sun to establish the solar orientation they desired. City planners oriented two main orthogonal streets, the decumanus, with an east-west alignment, and the cardo, a north-south alignment.

What were the main concerns of Roman astronomy according to Pliny?

One of the chief concerns of Roman astronomy according to Pliny was maintaining an accurate calendar. He wrote that there were three different solar and lunar calendars in use throughout the Roman Empire at the time of Julius Caesar, the Chaldean, the Egyptian, and the Greek, all of which were derived from the older Babylonian calendar.
